8 registered but only 6 went for the official opening of our 13th School Community Project: **Baan Yusuk Nursery** in Wiang Kaen; built at a cost of Baht 300,000. It was built bigger than proposed; the nursery ran out of fund and need to cut cost to complete the building. It does not have a ceiling & mozie netting for windows. SCOT EXCO has decided to provide another Baht 10k for the Nursery to install these for the comfort of the children. Our aim is to provide proper facilities for the 'Have-Nots'. Many thanks to Hock Chuan for sponsoring new clothes & brought JOY to the children.

Thereafter, we went for site inspection in **Baan Huai Khu School**, and decided to fulfill their request for a new canteen (*replacing a mud-hut*). Last stop of the day was Phu Chee Fa Forest Park, highly recommended by regulars to the north. The sunset view from **Phu Chee Fa (1628 metre)** was indeed breathtaking. Although we were in the middle of nowhere, we enjoyed simple but delicious food and genuine hospitality in the guesthouse we stayed in. On our last day (29.05), left our mark in the Golden Triangle; visited the **Opium Museum** and **Wat Roongkhun**. It was a tiring and full 2 days but soul fulfilling and enriching for the travelers.
